- **Collaboration and Community:** Engage with other educators and learners using OER, sharing best practices and fostering a collaborative learning environment.

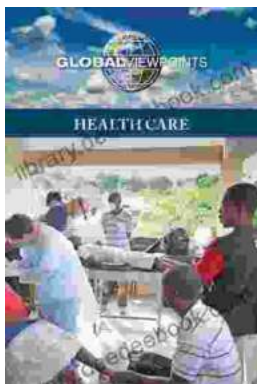

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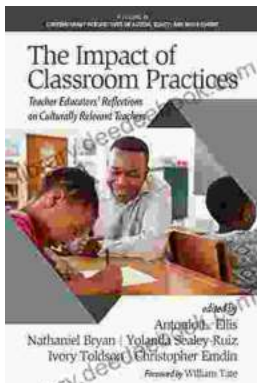


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
