


Matilda

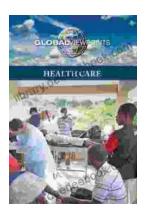

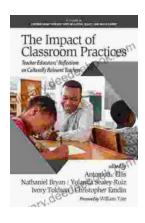
