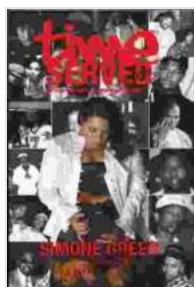


Time Served: My Days and Nights on Death Row Records | A Memoir

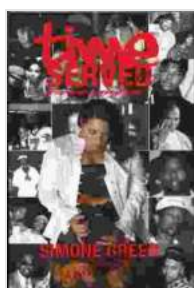

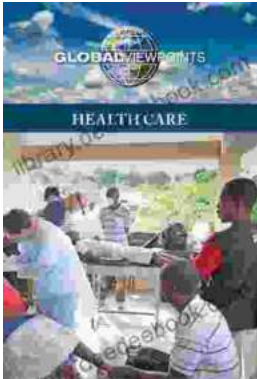

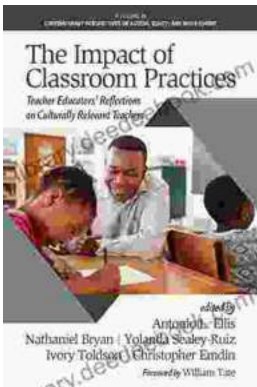
